Finally, be aware that the closing date for submissions regarding the Review of Termination of Pregnancy Laws in QLD closed on the 13 February this year. If you are a supporter of termination (FYI - I recently saw a patient who ordered her RU486 by mail), then a few issues might interest you.



I have discussed this with Dr Bill Boyd, President, AMAQ. The words mental health may be included in the legislation which create opportunities for abortion not obvious before. That is, it is currently likely that very few abortions are actually done for foetal anomaly and even fewer for maternal reasons. Stating 24 weeks as a limit for abortion in association with mental health concerns may lead to more abortions at a later date than currently, thus Queensland may become a preferred state. Also, which is worse for the mental health of the pregnant mother, abortion or adoption?



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Health Service Link - February 2018

Happy New Year to members of SCLMA!

2018 is shaping up to be another busy year for Sunshine Coast Hospital and Health Service.

Two important milestones occurred in January for our community:

On 29 January, 2018 we opened our Paediatric Critical Care Unit (PCCU) at Sunshine Coast University Hospital, which is a 24/7 service, treating children up to 16 years old with:

- life threatening, potentially recoverable illnesses or injuries
- actual or impending organ failure
- respiratory and cardiovascular conditions requiring support
- other conditions that need high-intensity medical and nursing care.

The PCCU is located within the ICU and is staffed by a multidisciplinary team including paediatric intensivists, specialised paediatric critical care nursing, and allied health staff.

At day 10, Dr Paula Lister, Director PCCU advises we have admitted 12 children and with the anticipated spectrum of cases including bronchiolitis, DKA, neonatal sepsis and seizures. Our parents have been very complimentary in their formal feedback, rating the service and the staff very highly (10/10). We are working on more child friendly features given this unit is co-located with adult ICU.

January also marked the launch of our planning for the integrated electronic Medical Record (ieMR). We're in the fortunate position of being able to learn from other Health Services who have preceded us, and have excellent clinician engagement and leadership under Dr Tanya Kelly to guide this journey. We are determined to realise the safety and quality benefits that flow from having key clinical information integrated in one place.

I am very pleased to report that the SCHHS has joined Choosing Wisely Australia, an initiative that helps improve the quality of care by eliminating treatments, tests and / or procedures that may be out-dated or that lack value for our patients and consumers. We have an enthusiastic team of clinicians who will be leading this work, to focus on preventing unnecessary risk of harm on the one hand and prioritising and investing in effective or evidence-based care on the other.

We remain committed to strengthening links between primary and tertiary care. Educational events for GPs are regularly held at the Sunshine Coast University Hospital and are very popular, with many GPs travelling from as far afield as Gympie and Tin Can bay to attend.



GP feedback has been very positive from an educational perspective, with requests for increased involvement by our SCHHS Specialists.

It is clear that our SCHHS specialists appreciate the chance to provide education to GPs on clinical and referral issues, and GPs welcome the chance to give feedback to the hospital and to learn about clinical developments and new services.

To this end, we plan to continue the Combined Specialties Saturday which allowed many different specialities to provide brief 30 minute presentations to GPs on focus areas. Development of the educational calendar for 2018 is well underway and we look forward to another year of strengthened communication and partnerships.

Over the past several weeks, we have been also been rolling out the GPs with special interest My eyebrows did raise when I heard we were employing gypsies in our health service. These GPSIs will work alongside specialists - for several months at a time - in outpatient clinics within our Health Service. We believe this program will encourage important relationships to be established between specialists and GPs and will improve our ongoing efforts at integration of care delivery. So far, we have commenced services delivered by suitably qualified GPs in the areas of Paediatric Medicine and Psychiatry. In the near future, GPSIs are anticipated to begin work in Dermatology, Rheumatology, Neurology and Urology.

Until next time, thank you for working with the SCHHS team to improve health outcomes for our community.


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AMA QUEENSLAND - CEO UPDATE - FEB 2018

Welcome to the new Health Ombudsman

The Queensland Health Minister has recently appointed Rachel Hunter as the new state's Health Ombudsman. AMA Queensland has been highly critical of the performance of the OHO and has long been calling for reforms to overhaul the system's current deficiencies and inefficiencies.

We look forward to working with the new Health Ombudsman on progressing urgent issues, such as constant budget overruns, investigations taking longer than their legislated timeframes and the high number of vexatious complaints, to ensure that the OHO becomes an efficient, fair and streamlined complaints management system.



MOCA 5 update

Our Workplace Relations Team spent the past six months working closely with our public hospitals members to finalise the log of claims for the upcoming Medical Officers' Certified Agreement 5 (MOCA 5) negotiations. The Team visited 12 hospital visits across the state and conducted meetings with regional, senior and junior medical officers to understand what the burning issues were for the new agreement. Along the way, more than 50 Salaried Medical Officers responded to our call to become MOCA 5 local representatives. In January, we presented both the senior and the junior doctors' log of claims to Queensland Health and we are now working to arrange a negotiation schedule ahead of the formal bargaining period commencing this month. The GP Liaison Unit is preparing for a busy, exciting year in 2018. We've got a fresh face joining our team;



- 3. **Bring GP experience**, skills and perspectives into outpatients, to improve service delivery and break down clinical care silos.
- 4. **Foster collegiality**, improve mutual understanding and respect between GPs and Specialists in our local area.

GPSIs will have direct clinical support from specialists, as they work within the speciality teams' clinics. Our Paediatric GPSI positions were advertised last year and have now been filled. We're in our second round of selecting GPSIs (applications now closed), to work in the Neurology, Rheumatology/Immunology, Urology and Dermatology teams.

This is an ongoing project and there will be more positions offered for more specialities throughout 2018. Currently, we are communicating these positions through our GPLO Email Newsletters to GP Practices, so keep an eye out. If you have a particular interest area and want to be kept in the loop, please get in contact with us.

GP Liaison Bulletin – what's happening in our Health Service lately?

The Health Provider Portal is now live – allowing GPs to view at their patients' QLD Health results (pathology, radiology), Emergency Department notes, and Outpatient appointment bookings, from their clinic computers. Immediate clinical information, right when you need it, mid-consultation. GPs who've signed up are giving us very positive feedback. Since October 2017, a Same-Day Discharge Summary standard is expected at SCHHS. We've already seen a big improvement in statistics in late 2017; some inpatient teams have produced outstanding results. However, January's junior doctor turnover is likely to impact performance temporarily. Discharge Summary timeliness is a key priority of the GPLO Unit, and we will continue to drive the implementation of the procedure throughout 2018.

Have you logged onto HealthPathways lately? There are an increasing number of localised health service information pages available, and as well as essential referral requirements for SCHHS specialty outpatient clinics. Please note, website is for health providers only to access.

What is the Integrated Care Alliance and why does it exist?

What is the Integrated Care Alliance?

The Integrated Care Alliance (ICA) is a small group with a passionate dedication to better connect and integrate health and care in our community. The ICA was first established in April 2016, with the support of the Sunshine Coast Hospital and Health Service and the PHN. It has brought together a team of GPs, clinicians, carers and health workers who are all working to build better person-centred care on the Sunshine Coast.

The ICA aims for people on the Sunshine Coast to experience continuity of care through an integrated health care system. The group is facilitating initiatives that better connect and integrate health care on the Sunshine Coast, with a particular focus on people experiencing chronic or complex conditions.

What does the Integrated Care Alliance do?

The past 18 months have seen the ICA bring together key international and national leads, like Dr Viktoria Stein, to kick start and assist a number of initiatives. These have included:

- A successful Falls Prevention co-design forum and action plan
- Data linkage teams looking at potentially preventable hospitalisations
- Hospital Avoidance initiatives particularly aimed at people with chronic and complex conditions

The past 18 months have seen the ICA pushing the current boundaries and practices to better connect and co-ordinate services. Consumers and carers are the key target of efforts to improve individual health literacy. While we look at health literacy at an individual level, general practice is a key area for delivering more effective treatment, closer to home.

Therefore it is essential that the ICA supports general practice through technology enablers, such as referrals and HealthPathways, which build clearer directions to navigate the management of complex care in areas like older person's health and chronic conditions. The efforts of general practice are essential in any process that looks to reduce potentially avoidable hospitalisations among people with chronic and complex conditions.

Why do these projects matter?

The research shows that people who are treated for complex or chronic conditions receive more effective care and experience better health outcomes in the primary care sector. Through the ICA over 30 members and 12 different organisations are able to seek and commission resources. This joint approach makes the most of the limited collective health and care resources we have. By working together, we strengthen the shared commitment to benefit our Sunshine Coast community and are accountable for our joint efforts.

Health System News Snapshot

Up-scheduling of Codeine

Codeine-containing medicines will no longer be available without a prescription from 01 February 2018. Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) decided to up-schedule over-the-counter codeine-containing medicines to prescription-only medicines from 01 February 2018, principally as a result of safety concerns.

This is consistent with the international status of codeine and is supported by major Australian clinical groups e.g., AMA, RACP, RACGP, and Faculty of Medicine. Scriptwise and NPS Medicinewise will communicate the changes. The Pharmaceutical Society of Australia and Pharmacy Guild of Australia have received funding from Australian Department of Health to deliver training modules for pharmacists and communication materials for the public.

TGA has developed a codeine information hub with details on the codeine scheduling decision.

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Rethinking your retirement needs

If you are planning how much you need to save for retirement, don't forget to include the costs of aged care. This is not just the cost of residential care, but should also include care in the home or support services to help you live independently as you age.

Factoring in the costs of aged care is becoming increasingly important with the emergence of home care, increasing longevity (living longer) and the rising incidence of dementia. Having the capacity to pay for services increases your range of choices and your ability to retain some independence. If you ignore the costs of aged care when planning the adequacy of retirement savings, you may fall short of predicting your real retirement income needs and run out of money too early.

The costs of home care

The costs of aged care have been increasing and are likely to continue to increase at a rate higher than inflation. When planning your retirement, consider the costs that you may incur in your latter years for:

- **Home care** home care costs can be difficult to predict and can vary from \$100 a week to \$5,000¹ a week depending on your care needs, family circumstances and your choice for what type of care you want. Government subsidies may help to drastically reduce the cost to you, but having adequate savings opens up the choices and ability to control the level and type of care received.
- **Capital expenditure** to make the home suitable for you as you age (e.g. widening doorways to enable wheelchairs and ramps).



Example: Francis is single and retires at age 67. She estimates that she will need \$43,695² per annum in retirement indexed to inflation. Her adviser calculates that she will need to save a superannuation balance of \$658,000 (based on an investment return of 6% pa and ignoring Centrelink benefits) to fund her income requirements to age 90.

Francis would prefer to keep living in her own home in her older years. If she adds in the need to pay home care costs of $$26,000^3$ per annum (in addition to government subsidies up to \$50,000 per annum) and one-off costs of \$50,000 to modify her home when she reaches age 85 (in today's dollars and indexed to inflation of 2% pa), the amount she needs to save is more like \$750,678.

Her current goal leaves her short by \$92,000 and her money is more likely to run out by age 87. This may also put more pressure on other family members.

Sunshine Coast Orthopaedic Clinic

The Acute Knee Clinic

The first few days can make all the difference in recovery from a sporting injury.

Dr Steve Lawrie at the Sunshine Coast Orthopaedic Clinic provides an Acute Knee Clinic each Monday and Tuesday which is specifically designed for, but not limited to, sports injuries of the knee with a view to rapid assessment, investigation and adoption of a management plan within the first few days of the initial injury.

The Acute Knee Clinic has now been running for twelve years. We have treated many professional and semi-professional athletes as well as the "weekend warriors", including a special interest in paediatric sporting injuries. Dr Lawrie has a close association with many sporting teams on the Sunshine Coast, including the Sunshine Coast Falcons, Melbourne Storm and many other local clubs.

Specific conditions that can benefit from emergent assessment include suspected ligamentous injuries, including cruciate ligaments, medial ligaments, multiple ligament injuries, acute patellar dislocation, locked knees and especially paediatric cruciate and meniscal injuries whether that be by implementing early surgical techniques

or an appropriate non-operative treatment programme.

To access the Acute Knee Clinic, a patient needs to have a current referral to Dr Steven Lawrie and plain x-rays of the knee should also be arranged before the initial consultation.

A plain x-ray is very important in the initial assessment to exclude fractures, loose bodies, and to show the alignment of the knee joint and the patellofemoral joint, which cannot be seen on other investigations, such as an MRI scan.

Splints and orthotics can be organized directly with Leonie Walton on 5473 5858. Leonie attends our clinic on a Thursday afternoon, but she is available throughout the week as needed.

The Acute Knee Clinic is intended to complement Dr Lawrie's other interests, including hip and knee replacement, revision arthroplasty, computer assisted joint replacement, cartilage surgery, as well as hip, knee and ankle arthroscopy.

Dr Lawrie is happy to take phone calls for advice, queries etc as this often helps the referral process.

Examples of these injuries include:

A medial ligament injury is usually easily treated in a range of motion brace, using an MCL protocol if applied with the 1st week or so. But it can be extremely difficult to correct if there is a delay of a number of weeks.

Paediatric meniscal tears may be repairable early after an injury, but a delay typically means meniscal resection becomes necessary.

Acute patellar dislocation may respond to surgical repair if surgery is offered in the first 2 weeks after the injury.

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



Medical Motoring

Collision Avoidance Technology





As we anxiously enter the age of driverless vehicles I'm aghast to see how many driverless cars already seem to be on Australian roads.

When I'm travelling I notice every day other motorists staring into their laps at their smart phones and not looking straight ahead at where they are going.

They are usually in cars that to the best of my knowledge aren't fitted with adaptive cruise control, lane guidance or autopilot collision avoidance systems.

So I can only assume that there is some sort of app on their smart phone which will alert them if necessary to the need to look up if driver input is required.

I'd say that any car being driven by someone distracted by a smart phone is in my opinion technically "driver-less".

In my practice I see people every week who have been terribly injured by being impacted from someone texting, Facebooking, Tweeting or Instagraming etc. I'm also very pleased to see how vigorously law enforcement officers breach distracted drivers for doing so.

With so much inattention on our roads it's great to see how much technology is already out there to augment rather than replace driver awareness.

My first experience of this was about five years ago in the car park of my local Volvo dealership to test the City Safety feature in a Volvo XC70.

The salesman told me to drive straight into a large cardboard box in the carpark.

Hard as I tried, the XCV70 just would not let me hit it as sensors mounted alongside the rear vision mirror detected an object in front of the vehicle and braked accordingly.

The system works to avoid collisions at speeds of up to 50 km/h.

Thereafter I've seen radar-based Adaptive Cruise Control appearing in many more affordable models such as Hyundai's i30 Elite.

The technology relies on the Doppler effect and the fact that radio-waves reflect from solid objects.

The vehicle will then adjust its speed +/- apply the brakes depending on the closing distance of another vehicle.

More recently a colleague proudly showed me his new Mercedes GLC 250d SUV which comes standard with Collision Prevention Assist.

In his first week of ownership the GLC's collision avoidance technology successfully helped him to avoid hitting a feral pig which suddenly darted across the road in front of him at mid-night.

But the collision avoidance system proved not to be infallible when he collided with a kangaroo at dusk one week later.

I think Mercedes can be forgiven if their technology works most reliably with pedestrians and walking beasts (cows, horses, sheep, goats etc).


Kangaroos and other hopping animals generally aren't encountered on German autobahns and the software may require some further tweaking.

Whilst all of this technology arguably makes driving safer, none of it should ever replace driver attention.


