The Federal Government tripling of the bulk billing incentive (from the 1st November with caveats) for GPs is useful for regional but not so much for metropolitan GPs. The incentive will now vary from \$20.65 (metropolitan and including Sunshine Coast) to \$31.95 (regional towns, e.g. Gympie) to \$34.05 (small rural towns, e.g. Maleny).

As you can see, if you are currently privately billing in the city, there is no incentive to go back to bulk billing.

Are hospital referral criteria (CPC) intended to stop referrals?

A comment we sometimes receive from referring clinicians is that the Clinical Prioritisation Criteria (CPC, also referred to as 'referral criteria') are designed by Queensland Health to make it 'harder' to refer patients or to 'stop' referring clinicians sending patients to the public system.

We were recently contacted by the gynaecology department after they had spent an afternoon calling 12 GP practices to chase up results for cervical screening tests, pelvic ultrasounds and other tests that were not included in referrals. They estimated that 25% of referrals to their specialty do not contain the required information, which means that it is impossible to triage for urgency (cat 1, 2 or 3). As a result, insufficient referral information leads to delays in scheduling appointments.

Another common cause for delay is not including height and weight when referring patients for procedures including endoscopy. A BMI is always required to plan procedures, including for example the appropriate theatre and associated risk management. Referrals can be declined if this information is not available to the triaging clinician.

CPC are State-wide criteria to assist with urgency categorisation and provide safe care - they are not developed with the intent to stop referrals. The CPC are regularly reviewed by multidisciplinary State-wide Clinical Advisory Committees which include GPs.

The CPC can be found on HealthPathways or the CPC website and are included in GP Smart Referrals (GPSR) to prompt referring GPs at the point of referral. Please adhere to these criteria and only use the clinical override option in GPSR if there is a contraindication or other medical reason why the requested information is not available.

Thank you for providing this information and ensuring clinical handover to the hospital is complete - to facilitate transfer of care.



New: Virtual Emergency Department to support GPs

Virtual ED offers alternative pathways that can help avoid your patient waiting in an Emergency Department. The Virtual ED Service is for Queensland GPs only.

Metro North Health has developed a State-wide Virtual Emergency Department service to provide primary healthcare providers with access to specialist emergency medicine advice, by telephone or video conferencing with a senior FACEM.

It is a safe, fast, and efficient way to consult with an emergency physician and use real-time technology to align treatment and ongoing services for your patient.

To access the virtual ED:

- 1. **GPs call 1300 VIRTED (1300 847 833).** Hours: 7 days per week (8am to 10pm Monday to Sunday). You will be connected directly to a senior emergency nurse who will rapidly triage your call.
- 2. Please have the following information ready (this will take less than 1 minute)
 - Clinician's name and phone number
 - An email or other link if you require video consultation
 - The patient's name, date of birth, hospital number (if available) and brief description of the problem
- 3. You will then be connected directly to an Emergency Specialist.

Sign your practice up for a new easier to read discharge summary format which includes test results.

Did you know that there is an improved discharge summary format available called Clinical Document Architecture (CDA) for discharge summaries that are sent electronically to practice software? CDA presents summaries in a more legible and structured format which includes Pathology and Radiology results.

How do I enable my practice to receive summaries in CDA format?

If you currently receive electronic discharge summaries, please email EDSTV-Corro@health.qld.gov.au with your practice software details. You will be signed up for CDA testing, and on completion your practice will be enabled.

Breast Density Trial – BreastScreen Qld

Screening participant and health service impact of population-based breast density notification in Australia: a co-designed randomised controlled trial in BreastScreen Queensland

On Thursday the 25th of May Dr Brooke Nickel, along with the BreastScreen Queensland Sunshine Coast service, presented at the Sunshine Coast Local Medical Association (LMA) dinner about the trial on breast density notification.

This is the first national and international randomised controlled trial on breast density notification and will be commencing across the Sunshine Coast service. It will test the immediate and longer-term impact of breast density notification on women, GPs, and screening services to help inform future policy and practice decisions.

Only in Queensland: GP Liaison network

In this month's MJA InSight we published an article about the Queensland General Practice Liaison (QGPL) network. Queensland's GPLOs play a unique role in identifying and addressing service gaps, facilitating appropriate clinical pathways, and improving transfer of care processes.

GPLOs have been pivotal in progressing major quality improvement initiatives, including GP Smart Referrals and other electronic communication tools, GP access to the Health Provider Portal, HealthPathways and new models of care such as hospital GPs with special interest (GPSIs). In the Sunshine Coast GPLOs facilitated the introduction of the Same Day Discharge Summary policy.

GPLOs further provide clinical handover workshops for junior hospital doctors and help organise interprofessional education opportunities.



Most of all Colin challenges us to think about our own death — we know our death is inevitable but how often do we talk about it with our family? How prepared are we? Have we made a will? Have we told anyone what we want for our funeral??? Sadly, for most of us, we don't discuss death, we try not to talk about death and we fear it.

In a knowledgeable, compassionate, often humorous style Dr Colin Dicks challenges us and urges us to not only to accept the inevitability of our death but prepare for it with anticipation. Most of all Colin challenges us to look at our present lives! How are we living each day? The analogy of the enjoyment of a warm donut with coffee is spot on! Colin asks each of us how many 'donuts' in our day? If not, why not! For me personally, reading Colin's book has been a wake-up call. It is shouting at me to make life changes to enjoy life to the full and to make that Will I've been putting off and to discuss my wishes for my funeral with my children!

Introducing Jo Shaw

I've also worked in cardiac and coronary care, haematology, bedside nursing in intensive care, community and primary healthcare and remote, rural and regional hospitals. I've completed six postgraduate courses, with the highest being a master's in nursing, leadership, and management.


Jo is passionate about patient care and community outcomes and believes in exemplary care - where everyone deserves to receive the same high level of care and the best outcome possible.

"I believe good leadership is so important in healthcare. The AAOS (American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons) have recently released new guidelines for management of knee osteoarthritis. This is now the third iteration of these evidence based guidelines. This year there is a complete re-write with recommendations being stratified according to the strength of evidence to support or not support the modality into strong, moderate or limited evidence. The following is a summary of these recommendations.

Strong Recommendations in favour of:

- ★★★★ Supervised exercise, unsupervised exercise &/or aquatic exercise
- ★★★★ Self-managed programmes
- **★★★** Patient education
- ★★★ Oral NSAIDs
- ★★★★ Oral paracetamol
- **★★★★** Topical NSAIDs

Moderate Recommendations in favour of:

- ★★★☆ Canes/Walking stick
- ★★★☆ Unloader braces
- ★★★☆ Neuromuscular training
- ★★★☆ Weight loss (evidence downgraded)
- ★★★☆ Intra-articular steroids
- ★★★☆ Arthroscopic partial meniscectomy can be used for meniscal tears in patients with mild to moderate osteoarthritis who have failed physical therapy and other nonsurgical treatments

Limited Recommendations in favour of:

★★☆☆ Oral/dietary supplements may be helpful but evidence is inconsistent/limited and additional research is needed to clarify the efficacy of;

Tumeric

Ginger extract

Glucosamine

Chondroitin

Vitamin D

(evidence downgraded)

- ★★☆☆ Manual therapy in addition to an exercise programme (evidence downgraded)
- ★★☆☆ Massage may be used in addition to usual care (evidence downgraded)
- ★★☆☆ FDA-approved laser treatment may be useful (evidence downgraded)

- ★★☆☆ Acupuncture may improve pain and function (evidence downgraded)
- ★★☆☆ TENS may be used to improve pain and or function (evidence downgraded)
 - a. Percutaneous Electrical Nerve Stimulation for pain and function
 - b. pulsed electromagnetic field therapy may improve pain (evidence downgraded)
- ★☆☆ Extracorporeal Shockwave therapy
- ★★☆☆ PRP
- ★★☆☆ Denervation therapy
- ★★☆☆ High Tibial Osteotomy

Strong recommendations against use of:

- ★★★ Lateral wedge insoles
- ★★★★ Oral narcotics including Tramadol

Moderate recommendations against use of:

- ★★☆ Hyaluronic acid intra-articular injections★★☆ Arthroscopic lavage and or debridement
- Consensus Statements; ★★★

Dry needling and free-floating interpositional devices should not be used

These recommendations can be used in determining management strategies in primary care management of knee osteoarthritis prior to considering knee replacement surgery.

Of particular interest is the new recommendation against any narcotic use, recommendations against hyaluronic injections, and recommends for arthroscopic partial meniscectomy if not responding to non-operative treatment in mild to moderate disease.



Didyouknowthatbowelcancerclaimsthelives of 103 Australians every week? Shockingly, that's approximately 5,354 people each year. It is the third most commonly diagnosed cancer globally and the second leading cause of

globally and the second leading cause of cancer-related deaths. However, advancements in prevention, screening, and treatment have improved outcomes for many patients.

Screening for bowel cancer is widely recommended, as early detection can lead to better treatment outcomes. Common screening methods include faecal occult blood tests (FOBTs) and colonoscopies. These tests can detect precancerous polyps or early-stage cancer, allowing for timely intervention.

Treatment for bowel cancer depends on the stage and location of the disease. It typically involves surgery to remove the tumour, and in some cases, radiation therapy, chemotherapy, or targeted therapy may be recommended. Precision medicine and immunotherapy are emerging areas of research that hold promise for more personalized and effective treatment approaches.

Screening participant and health service impact of populationbased breast density notification in Australia: a co-designed randomised controlled trial in BreastScreen Queensland

On Thursday the 25th of May Dr Brooke Nickel, along with the BreastScreen Queensland Sunshine Coast service, presented at the Sunshine Coast Local Medical Association (LMA) dinner about an upcoming trial on breast density notification.

This will be the first national and international randomised controlled trial on breast density notification and will be commencing in the next month across the Sunshine Coast service. It will test the immediate and longer-term impact of breast density notification on women, GPs, and screening services to help inform future policy and practice decisions.

Breast density notification is an important and controversial topic in Australia. You can read and listen to more about breast density and pros and cons of population-based breast density notification in the <u>April LMA newsletter</u> and <u>May LMA dinner presentation</u>.





The End of the 2023 Financial Year is Fast Approaching

The Australian Taxation Office (ATO) has indicated through various communication channels, the areas that they will be focusing their attention on this tax season.

The key areas that were identified by the ATO include:

- The accuracy o work-related expense claims
- Rental properties
- Capital gains tax on the disposal of CGT assets

The following items may be of assistance in the preparation of the 2022-23 individual tax returns:

- The rate for claiming car expenses is 78 cents per kilometre
- The rate for electric vehicles as per PCG 2023/D1 indicates a rate of 4.2 cents per kilometre for drivers who use the logbook method (and for Fringe Benefits Tax (FBT) purposes)
- Consider any claims for the cost and cleaning of occupation specific clothing, protective clothing, compulsory work uniforms and registered non-compulsory uniforms
- The \$250 non-deductible threshold for self-education expenses was removed on the 1 July 2022
- The rate for working-from-home (WFH) from 1 July 2022 as per PCG 2023/1 indicates that taxpayers claim WFH expenses at a rate of 67 cents per hour
 - 1 July 2022 to 28 February 2023 only, the ATO will allow taxpayers to keep a representative record of the total number of hours WFH
 - 1 March to 30 June 2023 and later income years, taxpayers must keep a record of the total number of actual hours WFH
- Please ensure that all rental income and expenditure is carefully recorded and presented
 - o Include all rental income received (before any expenses are deducted)
 - Ensure that interest expense and expenses generally, are claimed correctly by apportioning any private use as the non-deductible portion
 - Note that the ATO has access to information provided by financial institutions, of the details of loans that are associated with rental properties
 - Ensure that expenditure is characterised correctly as either a repair which is a deductible expense, or as a building cost and claimed as a capital works deduction
 - Remember the limitation placed on travel expenses and second-hand depreciable assets introduced on 1 July 2017
- Please include all capital gains and capital losses on Capital Gains Tax (CGT) assets on the sale of cryptocurrency, shares and property
 - o Ensure that the capital gain or capital loss is calculated correctly
 - o Report the capital gains in the tax return

CPA Australia has a three-step process called the "Three R's"

- 1. **Record everything** get your record keeping right by ensuring you have copies of receipts and keep a diary and note down information such as when you worked from home or travelled
- 2. **Be realistic** when submitting your tax return ensuring you are including appropriate expenses
- 3. **Reach out** "You can cut your own hair, but you'll get a better result if you see a professional." If you see a tax agent you can be confident you are paying the right amount of tax and getting the maximum refund you are entitled to.



PRESIDENT AND CEO REPORT

The state budget has been handed down, with a record health spend that is above the inflation rate and the implementation of more of our Ramping Roundtable recommendations. However, we are yet to see the Workforce Plan to find the thousands of new staff needed to meet increasing demand across the state. We have seen the reopening of the Gladstone Hospital maternity unit after almost a year on bypass, but other units remain closed around the state.

STATE BUDGET

The Queensland budget finally recognised it's not good enough to just keep level with inflation, delivering a 9.6 per cent increase in overall healthcare spending.

Our health investments must keep up with our rapidly growing population and increasing costs of delivering high-quality healthcare.

We were pleased to see our Ramping Roundtable recommendation to extend hospital transit and discharge lounge opening hours taken up. Allowing patients o be discharged after hours and on weekends will free up beds for patients waiting in emergency departments.

We welcome the detail around the financial incentives to attract interstate and international doctors and healthcare workers to rural and remote Queensland. We would like to see this scheme expanded to include GPs and other private specialists, not just Queensland Health employees.

However, this budget missed the opportunity to outline the strategy needed to find the workforce for our healthcare system. Queensland Health is finalising a Workforce Plan. This must look at the entire workforce – GPs, aged care staff, disability workers, private hospitals – as well as Queensland Health employees to identify current and future shortfalls and gaps.

We look forward to seeing more detail in coming weeks and working with the Minister on implementing these budget measures.

PAYROLL TAX

Treasurer Cameron Dick has made it clear the payroll tax amnesty for general practices will not be extended beyond June 2025. While we thank Queensland for being the only state or territory to offer an amnesty on the application of this new interpretation of tax laws, we will continue to advocate for an exemption for GPs.

We will make this an election issue next year as GPs will not be able to absorb the added tax and will have to pass it on to patients.

We hope that once again Queensland leads the way and recognises how important it is not to make access to GPs more expensive for patients, particularly in rural and remote areas.

We encourage all practices to seek legal and accounting advice about registering for the amnesty. Practices must complete an expression of interest form by 29 September 2023 to be eligible.

MATERNITY SERVICES



It is a great relief that maternity services have been restored at Gladstone Hospital after almost a year on bypass.

We look forward to seeing more details of how the \$42 million allocated in the state budget for maternity services will be used to fill workforce shortages that have led to many rural units closing or being put on indefinite bypass.


Health Minister Shannon Fentiman has made it clear in media interviews that she is working with AMA Queensland on solutions to the obstetrician shortage in regional Queensland and that the

first new staff recruited from interstate and overseas under the financial incentives offer will start work from 1 July.

We will continue to advocate for more obstetricians, anaesthetists and paediatricians to be recruited and retained in regional Queensland so other maternity units like Biloela and Cooktown can reopen.

BULK BILLING INCENTIVE RESOURCES

We have developed a suite of resources to inform patients about changes to the bulk billing incentive and why it will not impact their Medicare rebates. GENERAL PRACTICE

AMA Queensland is continuing to advocate for Queensland to follow Victoria's lead and offer financial incentives to medical graduates to pursue general practice as their specialty.

Victoria's GP training program was oversubscribed this year following the introduction of the incentives, while there are still places available in Queensland.

Currently only 15 per cent of medical students want to train as GPs, pointing to a looming shortfall over the next decade as GPs retire.



The state government says GPs are a federal issue but we believe all levels of government have a role to play. If you're a patient trying to make an after-hours appointment with your GP, you don't care where the funding comes from.

Queensland has seen a surge in children presenting to emergency departments as the winter flu and RSV season kicks in.

Our hospitals are overstretched and relying on the dedication and altruism of doctors, nurses and other healthcare workers to keep the system operating. We are urging all Queenslanders to get their influenza vaccinations and COVID boosters, to practise good hand hygiene, and to stay home if they are sick.

We have had more than 27,000 confirmed flu cases and almost 15,000 RSV cases in Queensland this year. While COVID cases are dropping, we are still seeing more than 500 new cases reported every day. All Queenslanders need to be vigilant about their own health and the health of others to avoid our hospitals becoming swamped with respiratory cases.

TOBACCO LAWS

New tobacco laws passed state parliament last month following strong AMA Queensland advocacy. The *Tobacco and Other Smoking Products Amendment Act* introduces a licensing regime for nicotine products, including vapes and e-cigarettes, with new offences and penalties, and stronger enforcement.

We have been calling for this action for years. Last year, Queensland received the Dirty Ashtray Award for the government's failure to enforce regulations around the sale of vapes. Hopefully this will ensure we do not receive this award again.

We are seeing welcome moves at both the state and federal levels to crack down on non-prescription nicotine products to protect young people from nicotine addiction and lung damage.
